Provence

Makes for a great get away from the UK. In April we can offer early season fully guided trips including all equipment. We cater for both novice and experienced paddlers. We will pick you up from Nice Airport, and transfer you to your accommodation, either camping or Chalet. We are based near to the fantastic medieval town of Entrevaux, with its narrow streets and hidden small bars and restaurants.

Provence is an area far greater in size than the UK West Country. Stretching from the Italian boarder and the Maritime Alps in the east, to the salt marshes of the Camargue in the west Its Northern borders with 3000m peaks reach into the Southern French Alps and the Massif Central.

The area is known mostly for its food, fine wine and beach resorts along the rich Cote d'Azur. However away from the frantic coast, the inland areas abound with a multitude of rivers running down quiet sunlit valleys, under a blue Mediterranean sky.

Here paddlers can find every grade of white water. The season usually begins at the end of March and extends well into May however April is the best month.

Before the alpine season begins this is where you will find Canoe Control. We may-be paddling open boats down warm valleys and lazy rivers, or pulling a Kayak into the last eddy in order to check the next class four drop. The number and variety of the rivers found in the area is almost endless. The Var has around 60km of top white water ranging from grade 2 to 5. It also has the best class three trip in Western Europe, the Gorge Daluis.

The River Verdon features the 'Gorge du Verdon', the Grand Canyon of Europe, which most paddlers are aware of but not aware of the fantastic grade 2-3 open boating further upstream in the mountains. The Grandcanyon of the Verdon is another of the many river options available. Because the Canyon is like a mini expedition it has a seprate description on this site .

The Journey to your spring time paddle is easy, You can just fly from London to Nice. We provide a minibus transfer to meet you on Saturday afternoon and return you to Nice for your departure (no transfer fee). Flight prices range from around £60 and upward for a single return. Driving to us, just follow the auto routes to Lyon then onwards direction Marseille, go past Aix-en-Provence, then onto the auto route to Nice then onto the RN202 to Entrevaux.

Course description.

This is a course designed to give you the core skills needed to progress with confidence in your new sport. Learn under expert tuition from professional coaches who spend their lives running rivers around the world. Our coaching is very structured and educational based however; a great deal of what you learn will come from you. By applying the use of experiential learning and led discovery techniques, knowledge is imparted to you the learner faster and more effectively. There are no strict syllabi; if your progression is fast we will develop your paddling on beyond the boundaries of other courses.

Course description.

This course is designed, for people following on from their fundamental course, or paddlers who have already acquired some skill but feel they need to develop a greater understanding of just what is going on. This course will help you to establish that understanding of the relationship between your body, boat and blade. As well as calm water, we use suitable moving water venue's to highlight the practical use of paddling technique. This helps the learner to grasp the nature of their boat, relative to the water they are on. By using moving water early on in a paddler's development, it helps the paddler to recognize paddle strokes and boat control that is, efficient, effective and safe. Once again there are no strict syllabi; if your progression is fast we will develop your paddling on beyond the boundaries of other course.

Many bank and boat based rescue methods will be practiced in a real river environment. The white water site chosen will pose a number of practical problems for us to resolve. Expect to get wet but

unlike the UK the bank side temp will be around 30c. Lunch will be taken sometime in the day. At the end of the day full equipment review. What worked and how much gear do we really need to carry?

17-00. Head for base. Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee. Look back and review the day. This evening we will plan an all day river trip. As we have said your progression will be fast we will develop your paddling forward, not held back by boundaries of a set course. The next day will give us an even greater chance to develop individual skills.

19-30. Dinner.

Day 04.

09-15. Start.

This will be an all day river trip. We will take lunch with us. The river will present us with a whole array of practical workshops, giving you the opportunity to develop your individual skills. This trip will also allow us to expand upon different leadership styles, and look more closely at group dynamics and management. Canoe Control Advanced White Water Kayak.

Provence.

(Included within the core course structure will be the present day New BCU 5 star training and ww safety and rescue.)

Course description.

This is the ideal course for the progressive Kayaker wanting to step up and dramatically improve their ability. Our course days will be spent on grade 3-4 white water. At this level of boating technical flaws can quickly be identified. To resolve any paddling issues, the first morning will be used to analyze students boating skills. To this end a non-remote site, specific to the course standard will be used. The course group, will then descent a section of river, chosen for its suitability. Numerous types of rapids will be run, rocky steep technical, pool drop and continues, slides, drops, slots etc. Differing styles and merits of running each rapid will be reviewed. What are the seen dangers trees, stoppers, pinning rocks. What about the unseen dangers undercuts, siphons and entrapment etc? The consequences of all will be examined discussed. Safety will be applied if its felt warranted. On the river there will be sessions on group and self-awareness.

At the end of each day there will be a video and review. Students will have a full debrief on their day. This course will be presented by river professional's guides/coaches who work their life on the rivers of the world

Day 02. The week's operational river remit will be around grade 3+ 4.

09-00. All courses meet for morning coffee and the weeks briefing.

09-30. Boat check or boat fit out and gear check. A full appraisal will be made of the gear you wear and carry in your boat? As with all courses good serviceable equipment is very important. However this course will put greater demand on you and your gear.

10-30. Load up boats and head for your first Alpine boating location.

Safety brief and activity. A great location that all paddles or novice will have fun on. This will give myself and staff chance to assess and finalise plans for the week ahead. However

For this morning we will build our session around a clean grade 3 rapid. Here we will apply the old maxim, go for hard moves/eddies on the easier rapids, rather than easy moves on hard rapids.

Here we will be able to look more closely at group dynamics and differing leadership styles. What are the seen dangers trees, stoppers, pinning rocks. What about the unseen dangers undercuts, siphons and entrapment etc? The consequences of all will be examined discussed. Safety will be applied if its felt warranted.

12-30 to 13-15 Lunch.

The after-noon's session will be an extension of the mornings. Time will be spent on developing styles and techniques to improve boat control and performance. Body posture, active blade the and still evolving importance of forward paddling.

17-00. Head for base. Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee. Relaxed discussion/video about your day, and the week ahead.

19-30. Dinner.

Day 04.

09-15. Start.

This day will be a full rescue day on a specific site (not a slalom course). The rescue equipment you carry in your boats will be used, hence the first day appraisal. We will be looking and dealing with issues created by paddling grade 3-4 water. Bank and boat based rescue methods will be practiced in a real river environment.

12-30 to 13-15 Lunch.

All members of the group will be completely involved in the management of the sessions. Expect to get wet but unlike the UK the bank side temp will be around 25-30c. At the end of the day we will carry out a full review on performance and equipment. What worked and how much gear do we really need to carry? It will be a great learning day and a lot of fun.

17-00. Head for base. Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee. Look back and review the day. This evening we will plan an all day river trip for the next day. The trip will give us all a great chance to develop our individual skills.

19-30. Dinner.

Day 05.

09-15. Start.

This will be an all day river trip on grade 3 and 4 water. We will take lunch with us. The river will present us with a whole array of practical workshops, giving you the opportunity to develop your individual skills. This trip will also allow us to expand upon different

leadership styles, and look more closely at group dynamics and management. The technical difficulty of the river will increase, creating fresh demands; these demands may expose areas of technique that can be improved upon.

17-00. Head for base. Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee. Personal 1x1 discussion/debrief on how you feel about your personal performance. Plan together the next day, which will reflect the result of development over the last few days.

19-30. Dinner.

Day 06.

09-15. Start.

We take lunch with us. On today's paddling trip the core element is grade 4. You will develop your skills on a couple of rapids that you can easily repeat a couple of times. This will help you to consolidate your boating, and for you to analyse the progression made.

17-00. Head for base.

Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee relaxed discussion, review of the week and your progress

19-30. Dinner.

Day 07.

09-15. Start.

We will paddle a familiar short section of river. This will make the morning session one of further consolidation. We now you will be very surprised how fast you have progressed. We will join one of the other groups for a combined lunch. Perhaps a relaxing afternoons river play where it started almost a week before, a chance of a pool session to perfect your kayak rolling. Or just the opportunity to relax with a book in the shade.

17-00. Head for base. Arrive dry gear and freshen up.

18-00. Afternoon tea/coffee. Finalising your personal action plan for the future.

19-30. Dinner.

Day 08. Depart.

Self-catering Chalet £680 - 6 river days 7 nights accommodation.

The accommodation is well fitted out however bring your own sleeping bag.

Self-catering camping £570 - 6 river days 7 nights accommodation
